We changed our community and world. \$25,000 of our offering was graciously given to our synod to alter the face of hunger, campus ministry, camp ministry, disaster response, and more. Our prayer shawl women, quilters, and individual members donated quilts, school kits, layettes, and health kits, in the hundreds. Our Sunday School children provided a mattress, new dress and shoes, and a roof for Salome (our sponsor child), while also purchasing \$1000 of Lutheran World Relief animals to help world communities in need. The Vacation Bible School children offered over \$650 to the Transitional Living Center of Burlington! We provided dozens of meals for our community, not to mention Thanksgiving meals and Christmas gifts.

I can't even begin to estimate the total number of volunteer hours our members of Cross contributed. And someone once asked what Cross Lutheran Church is known for. Maybe we are too humble, maybe not. Either way, the real thanks goes to God. Without the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit, none of this would have happened. In fact, without Jesus, Cross Lutheran wouldn't even exist. And rather than Cross Lutheran Church being located on the corner of Hwy 11 and W, there might be another gas station.

What better way to begin a new year than by giving thanks for the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit? I give thanks to God for you, and I boldly ask you to commit – or recommit – to the ministry of Jesus Christ happening at Cross Lutheran Church. God is doing something great in you. Take this new year as the opportunity to give thanks and take part in these great things happening at Cross Lutheran Church! Seriously, if not now, when? Amen. Thanks be to God!!

El Salvador Mission Trip

Several members of Cross leave for El Salvador on Feb 11 - 19. The goal is to build homes and build relationships. El Salvador has a rich cultural history; the people are humble, considerate and hard working. Faith plays an integral part in the lives of the Salvadoran people. The country is still recovering from a brutal civil war (1982-1992); several earthquakes, hurricanes and mudslides have proven recently devastating to the country. Habitat Builds Worldwide, in partnership with Thrivent Financial for Lutherans, partners with the Lutheran Church of El Salvador and several communities in rebuilding homes and lives. Together, we build in Christ!

 b) Answer? The mosquito. Mosquitoes infect nearly 5.5 million people in Malawi with malaria every year—that's one in three people in the whole country. Of those infected, 6,500 die each year—and more than half of these deaths are kids under 5 years old. We're not okay with that. Our 6th-12th graders are putting together a Dodgeball Tournament for the Burlington area to raise money for nets to protect people against malaria. Andrew Griesman's Mission Trip June 2012

We are asking our Cross Family to support both in prayers and finances a Faith Medical Mission trip that Andrew will be going on with his Grandpa next summer in Central America. He will be graduating in May of 2012 from Gustavus Adolphus College, and will then be entering Luther Seminary in the fall. We thought this would be a great graduation "gift" opportunity for him, as he had originally planned to do a year long mission service project through the ELCA and then go to seminary. Circumstances changed, he fell in love and they are getting married in October 2012, so a year in the mission field is not going to work. The opportunity to serve on mission trips has become a passion for him, as he has been on 3 in the past and has witnessed his grandpa's many trips volunteering his skill and expertise as a dentist. In one of his seminarian application answers Andrew wrote of Boppa, "...for all of these years he has selflessly served those who are less fortunate and enraptured our family with tales of exploration and service...I hope to reflect that compassion and service with my work as a pastor."

I have put together a couple of different calendars of photos that I have taken on my mission trips, and am offering it as a gift to those who are able to support financially.

Meeting called to order at 6:36. Pastor Carolyn led prayer.

Brian Penny led devotions.

The minutes from the November 3 Mission Council meeting were approved.

Margo Griesman brought to the council her request to raise funds for her son Andrew to attend a one-year youth mission program in June, 2012. Motion approved.

Pastor Carolyn's Report:

New members will be installed on December 4 at the 10am service. A new member orientation will be offered on February 26 at 11:15 am.

\$215,540.00 has been pledged, as of December 1, for general budget.

Confirmation students and parents are required to attend a bullying awareness program on Wednesday, January 18 at 6:30-8:00 pm. This is open to the community.

A Google Voice phone number for after-hours emergencies has been set up. The number is 262-757-8111. When callers get our answering message, they will be prompted to call this number, which will then ring through the pastors' cell phones and home phone numbers.

Pastor Corrine's Report:

Youth & Family Team is focusing more on cross-generational ministry, which encompasses the entire church.

The youth group for 3rd-5th grade students has been cancelled. Dara Stull, Program Director of Imago Dei through Crossways Camping Ministries is coming in January to talk with parents about camp.

The next Men at Play event will be at the parsonage on January 8 at 7:00 pm. They will also host a CPR/AED training on January 21 at 9:00 am.

The Christmas Program will be December 18 at 10:00 am. Christmas Eve worship is at 4:00 pm and 10:00 pm. Christmas Day worship is at 9:00 am. There will be worship at 5:00 pm on New Year's Eve and at 9:00 am on New Year's Day.

Mission Council President's Report: Brian attended the Business Board meeting last month. They reviewed the insurance plan the church has with Church Mutual for any areas on which to save money, as this is one of Cross' larger expenses. The proposed budget will be finalized in time for the January 29 annual meeting

Reports from Ministry Teams:

Growing Team Report: The Tuesday Gospel Gatherings is studying the Messiah. In January, they will view a movie on Martin Luther and do a study on angels. 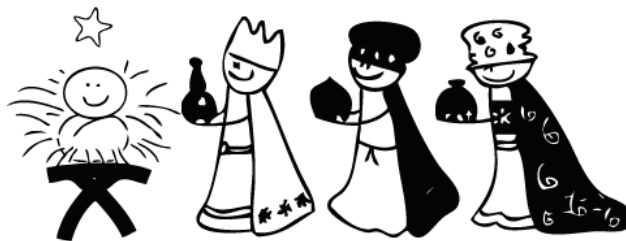
