# VETERANS RECOGNITION PROGRAM— Held on Sunday, November 5, 2023





























## I've heard a little about this RIC. What is it about?

Reconciling in Christ (RIC) is a program that is a public way for faith communities to see, name, celebrate, and advocate for people of all sexual orientations, gender identities, gender expressions, and people of color.

RIC started in 1983 with a few congregations in U.S. and Canada, the program has grown to include hundreds of faith communities. There are 29 other ELCA churches in the Greater Milwaukee Synod with the Reconciling in Christ designation.

## Why does this matter?

The Reconciling in Christ designation is a tangible signal to the community that our congregation is a safe haven, a place where all people are accepted and welcomed as they are. According to Reconciling Works, the demographic most often drawn in by RIC status is young couples with families as they seek to raise their children in ways consistent with their values and surrounded by diversity.

In addition, research from the Trevor Project shows that one in five (21%) LGBTQ youth reported that their religion or spirituality is important or very important to them. Nearly one in four (23%) LGBTQ youth reported engaging in prayer, meditation, or private reflection on their religion on at least a weekly or daily basis. All of this points to the importance of making sure congregations are safe and affirming places for LGBTQ members.

## Where is Cross on its RIC journey?

At Cross, we are just starting the process of exploring how to become an RIC designated congregation. We are putting together a Core Team of 3-5 members who are interested in developing our ministry of reconciliation.

## How long will it take to become an RIC designated church?

It's anticipated the process of becoming a Reconciling in Christ designated congregation will take 9-10 months. The process will conclude with a congregation vote.

**NOTE** – Pastor John abstained from the discussion and vote.




