CROSS CONNECTIONS

Dear Fellow Members of Cross,

Several years ago, at a Synod Assembly, I heard seminary professor and theologian Mark Allen Powell speak about stewardship, specifically about financial stewardship. In his book, *Giving to God: The Bible's Good News about Living a Generous Life*, he speaks openly and frankly about financial giving as being not only a "way of life," but also a "good way of life."

The problem is that many of us forget that giving, tithing, offering gifts back to God is part of our faith life – just like reading scripture and prayer. Too often we see the church as just another bill to be paid. The bills come in every month, and so we need to pay them. We forget that the church is so much more. It is a place of worship, a place where ministry ideas begin, and a place through which God works.

As faithful Christians, we have to look at the finances of the church and wonder why the church struggles with meeting financial obligations? One reason is that many see money as a means to exert power. We use our money to show the importance of things. As we read in Matthew 6:21, "For where your treasure is, there your heart will be also." Money gives significance to issues, programs, and institutions. With money, we have the power to sway decisions by our choice to give or not.

The opposite of money as power is the fear of scarcity. We live in this fear when we look at our limited income and fear that God cannot help us once the money is gone. When this fear drives our giving philosophy, we choose to give to God only what is left over — once all the bills have been paid. It's a struggle for us to choose to give to God first. The Israelites were called to bring the first fruits of their harvest to God, and so are we - not in obedience, but in faith and thanksgiving. We are called to give in recognition that all we have comes from God.

Mr. Powell shares an interesting image in his book. He talks about money related to baptism and thinks of it as a person being baptized, but holding his or her wallet out of the baptismal waters. We give all we are to God in baptism, but "save the wallet."

God calls us to give, and give generously – not as a burden, but as a gift of thanksgiving. In Scripture we see that a tithe -10% - is a good and acceptable practice. I've been asked before if that means net or gross income. I don't know that it matters as long as we spend time in prayer asking God for guidance.

Recent statistics show that, on average, giving to the church averages less than 2% of income? We are all in different places in our lives. We have different financial goals and financial responsibilities. This means that our giving is also going to look very different. Giving generously looks different for each one of us. Giving joyfully can look the same.

Please consider a challenge. First, sit down at some point and take a good look at your personal giving pattern. If you give occasionally – when you have spare change - try and become a "regular" giver. Make a plan to give a certain amount each week or month. If you are already giving regularly, figure out what percentage of your income you give. Then make a plan to increase that gift. Perhaps you want to raise it by 1%, or maybe by 50 cents or even \$5. Remember, generosity looks different for each one of us.

All things are done through prayer and supplication. But in the end, it will be good to find joy in giving. Giving as a response to our baptismal call, not as another bill to pay. Giving as a way of worship, not a debt. Giving in finding joy in the ways in which God lives and moves and has his being here in this place. Thanks be to God!!







Along with the card, \$35 was enclosed for a birthday party and an additional \$9 to help with overseas delivery of the card. In a progress report received in October, Clarisse indicated that she was in primary school studying in grade five. Clarisse lives in the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC) which is a country in Central Africa. The official language is French. DRC is among the five poorest nations in the world. In 2021, nearly 64% of Congolese, just under 60 million people, lived on less than \$2.15 a day."

Christmas cards for Clarisse, Jessicca and Mapenzi were received, personalized and returned to World Vision. The pop-up cards tell the story of Jesus' birth. The President and CEO of World Vision, Edgar Sandoval Sr. wrote "We are so blessed to be able to participate in God's good work by helping bring joy into the lives of children at Christmas" and "I am grateful for your continuing presence in your sponsored children's lives. Your support truly gives them hope.

In the near future the main Narthex entrance door will be replaced with a sliding glass door. The glass side panels on both side of the door will be replaced as well. The new door will have an electric eye that will sense when a person is approaching and automatically open. This will be a great improvement for handicap accessibility.
