Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of services, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of activities, but it is the same God who activates all of them in everyone. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good.

1 Corinthians 12:4-7

Dear Fellow Workers in Christ.

This month we celebrate the Day of Pentecost – the day we hear how the Holy Spirit breathed on all the believers and the Church was born. The Spirit didn't just touch certain people with amazing gifts. *All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit.* (Acts 2:4). It had to be an amazing experience and a wonderful thing to be a part of. The experience filled them with such awe that *all who believed were together and had all things in common; they would sell their possessions and goods and distribute the proceeds to all, as any had need.* (Acts 2:44-45).

We don't get to experience the outpouring of the Holy Spirit in quite the same way as they did some 2100 years ago. Ours is a bit more subdued and perhaps understated. Each year, at our semi-annual meeting (this year on May 7), we come together and witness the work of the Spirit as we elect our leadership for the coming year. There are no tongues of flame and no violent wind, but the same Spirit wells up in those who have stepped forward to serve.

Unfortunately, it sometimes takes work to "find" these leaders as phone calls are made, conversations had in church, and mission moments given to seek to embolden people to say, "Yes!". This year, you'll see that we have a full slate of names to fill all positions except for the Nominating Team. This, I imagine, is due to two misunderstandings; people don't see this as a "leadership" team; or they see it as too much work to try to convince people to serve. I suspect it's mostly the second.

If we truly understood the Holy Spirit and how it is at work in each one of us today, the Nominating Committee would have the easiest job of all and not have to ask <u>anyone</u> to serve. Their work would shift to making sure we have the best candidates for each position. If we truly understood how the Spirit works through our faith, we wouldn't be afraid to step forward and say, "I would like to ...".

We tend to forget that the gifts we have are not for hiding; nor are they to be forgotten. We are encouraged – called – to share our gifts, to live as part of the Body of Christ. For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. 13 For in the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body. (1 Corinthians 12:12-13a). God's intention is not that we wait to be called. We are called to step up and ask where we can serve.

To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. (1 Corinthians 12:7). It isn't a question of <u>if</u> you will serve. The question is, <u>where will you serve</u>? How will you serve? Yes, leadership teams are set for the year, but we still need everyone to step up and find a place to help this wonderful Body of Christ move forward in God's mission.





SERVING TEAM—COLLECTION EVENT FOR MAY



Pastors' Highlights;

• Pastor John, Holy week was fun and Easter was awesome! There were 163 in attendance which was so good to see.

There are three classes left of confirmation. The remaining sessions will focus on discussing difficult questions about being a Lutheran.

The Saturday service liturgy will be changing to Setting 10.

Pastor John and Bob will be installing security cameras, one overlooking the narthex and the other at the carport doors. The carport door will also have a doorbell. Pastor will look for some type of doorbell for the new narthex sliding doors, and possibly an additional camera for the education doors.

Major Ministries

- RIC Discussion Pastor John was pleased with the conversation he had with Ashlei, the Director of Program and Engagement of the ELCA. She was able to answer all of the questions he and the council had. Next, we will put together a core group of volunteers who are passionate about welcoming and inclusion at Cross. In May look for a newsletter item and a Mission Moment to let people know we are looking for volunteers for the core group leadership roles.

The Business Board approved that \$11,000 from the Undesignated Memorial Fund be used for the purchase of the sign. This is in addition to the approved \$5000.00 from the Endowment Board along with the profits from the turkey dinner. Marie will be in contact with the Building and Grounds Committee regarding permits, sign placement, etc.
- **Solar Panels** A motion was made at the annual meeting to have the church look into the use of solar panels. Marie has agreed to be the point person to research the solar panels and the heat pump option.
- Mission Council Leadership Tonight is Marie Way's last Mission Council meeting after fulfilling a six-year term. Council discussed her replacement as Vice President. It was decided to table further discussion until the May meeting with our two new council representatives. Terry Erb has also completed her six-year term. We will miss the leadership and enthusiasm that both Marie and Terry have given to the Mission Council over these past six years.


