CROSS CONNECTIONS—November 2023

Dear Family in Christ,

This is a month of Thanksgiving. We begin by saying thank you to all of our veterans who stepped up in service to our country. We end the month with Thanksgiving Day, where we remember in thanksgiving all the blessings we have received.

We are good at being thankful when we are reminded of those blessings. At our Thanksgiving dinners, many will take turns listing those things for which they are thankful. We may grumble at having to do this before we eat, but we usually get through it. We list off things like family, jobs, a home, and other tangible things. We may even go deeper and be thankful for love or the opportunity to love.

If we read Paul's letter to the Philippians, we find a different idea for thanksgiving. He writes, "Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God." (Philippians 4:6)

In other words, when you have concerns, worries, frustrations – pray in thanksgiving. This seems counterintuitive when we think about our normal times of thanksgiving. We usually give thanks for good things, for positive feelings, for success. When we are happy, we say "Thank you, God." When we receive exciting, life-changing news, we cry out, "Thank God!" When we consider the house we live in, the cars we drive, the loving families around us we pray, "Thank you, God, for all you do."

When we are worried, angry, or frustrated our prayers tend to be more in the line of, "Please, God, fix it", or "God, why?!" Much of the time, God is the last one we want to talk to. Yet we are called to pray in thanksgiving – not thanksgiving for those things that worry or frustrate us, but thanksgiving for God's presence and promises.

To get a grasp of this kind of thanksgiving, we have to look further in the Bible. The books of Revelation and Daniel are filled with Apocalyptic imagery. They are written to oppressed peoples in search of hope. In short, they say, "I know you're suffering now, but in the end – God Wins." We can also look to Mary, the mother of Jesus.

Upon hearing that she would bear the Son of God, Mary brings forth her Song of Praise. In it, she says, "He has shown strength", "He has scattered the proud", "He has brought down the powerful ... and sent the rich away empty." (Luke 1) Mary was praying with thanksgiving for things that had yet to come! She knew what the birth of her son meant for the world. She knew that through Jesus, God was about to do incredible things – not through power and riches, but through the love of His Son.

When our worry and stress bring us to prayer, we are encouraged to pray in thanksgiving because God has NOT deserted us. We pray in thanksgiving because in the end, God wins. We pray in thanksgiving because no matter how dark a place the world may become, the light of Jesus Christ is never darkened. The light will always overcome the darkness.

Paul continues to the Philippians, "And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus." (Philippians 4:7) We may not understand how God works in the world, but when we are able to open our minds in prayers of thanksgiving – God promises to give us peace, strength, and courage in whatever we are facing.

Be bold in your thanksgiving this year! Be thankful for what God is about to do in the world and in our lives!

Reconciling in Christ Journey



October 19, 2023

Dear Cross members,

Since announcing our intention to become a Reconciling in Christ (RIC) Congregation, I've received many positive comments about this journey.

To recap, Reconciling in Christ is a program that is a public way for faith communities to see, name, celebrate, and advocate for people of all sexual orientations, gender identities, gender expressions, and people of color. There are 29 other ELCA churches in the Greater Milwaukee Synod with the Reconciling in Christ designation.

At Cross, we are in the process of putting together a Core Team of 3-5 members who are interested in developing our ministry of reconciliation.

The Core Team's role

The Core Team will explore the Reconciling in Christ process and the steps toward receiving an RIC designation. The Core Team will share information with Cross members about what it means to be an RIC designated church and address any members' questions about the RIC process and designation. Some of the team's activities could include holding forums, conducting one-on-one visits and visiting other RIC designated churches.

If Cross decides to become RIC designated, the Core Team will craft a Welcome Statement aligned with RIC guidelines. It's anticipated the process of becoming a Reconciling in Christ designated congregation will take 9-10 months. The process will conclude with a congregation vote.



Motivated by our faith in Jesus Christ, we serve alongside the poor and oppressed as a demonstration of God's unconditional love for all people. World Vision serves all people, regardless of religion, race, ethnicity, or gender.

Annual progress and thank you reports were recently received for Clarisse and Mapenzi, the two girls that Cross sponsors through World Vision.

Clarisse, 17 years old, lives in the Kintanu Community in the Democratic Republic of the Congo. She reported that she is in primary school studying grade five. Her report noted that females with some secondary education in the DR Congo is 40.3 % in comparison to 96.5% of females in the United States. World Vision constantly monitors Clarisse's well-being and her health was good. Clarisse indicated that she and her family participated in and benefited from: School supplies, Reading/writing workshop, Water source protection awareness, Child protection awareness and Children's clubs.

Mapenzi, 10 years old, lives in the Marafa Community in Kenya. She indicated that she was in primary school studying grade five. Her report noted that in Kenya 31.1% of females have some secondary education compared to 96.5% in the United States. She related that World Vision was constantly monitoring her well-being and that currently her health was good. This year, Mapenzi and her family participated in and benefited from: Bible study, School enrollment/attendance awareness, Hygiene education, and Community leadership training.

Cecile, the manager of the Kintanu Area Program and Samuel, the manager of The Marafa Area Program, wrote notes of thanks for the support of Clarisse and Mapenzi and their communities. They stated that because of that support, children's lives were changing and they both ended with "God bless you".

It was indicated that we can give with confidence because "In 2022, 89% of World Vision's total operating expenses were used for programs that benefit children, families, and communities in need. World Vision provides hope and assistance to communities through our presence in nearly 100 countries.


