Dear Siblings in Christ,

My family has recently begun a new journey. It started out simply and innocently enough. When one of us brought home a fish from the Jamboree in May we thought, "Well, it will last a few weeks." Then we bought a small aquarium with a filter for it. And, of course, it seemed to love it. Then we thought we should go and buy a bigger aquarium and get it some companions. It seemed that a 10 gallon tank should suffice.

Oh, but you head down that road and you read and listen and learn. We walked into the pet store ready to buy that 10 gallon aquarium, only to be told that a goldfish – a single goldfish – requires at least a 40 gallon tank by itself! It turns out they tend to live for several years and grow – to as long as 12 inches!

We came home with a 55 gallon aquarium.

It didn't end there. Now we are learning about filters, water heaters, substrate, and decorations. I always imagined you just put it all together and filled the tank and, voila! You're ready for fish! It turns out, though, that the tank takes time to cycle and get the proper balance of ammonia, nitrites, nitrates, and so much more before you can even begin to add fish. Talk about confusing and oh, so frustrating!

Our faith can be just as confusing and frustrating. When we are children, faith seems so simple. We learn that God made the earth and everything in it and Jesus died for our sins. As children, we believe because we are told – not because we understand. As adults, sometimes we think faith should be just as simple. We say the Creed on Sunday and that should be enough.

Then life hits us.

Those simple statements of faith don't get us through the hard times – the scary doctor visits, the lost jobs, divorce, death. That's when we learn that we need to know more about God and how God walks with us. It's in those times that we want to turn to God, but we just don't understand how. We don't have the tools.

This is why we bring our kids to be baptized, then to Sunday school, and then Confirmation. That need for faith is why we say, over and over again, that Confirmation is not graduation. We never stop learning. We never stop growing. Teenagers are learning so much about life, and if they have no foundation in faith they have no way of growing in God. As adults, we think we have learned it all. We are busy working and raising families. We don't have time for God. Until we need to make time because we *need* God.

If that time comes and all we have is that Sunday school understanding of God and Jesus, we will flounder. We will be confused. We will be frustrated.

A while ago, I talked about Jonah in a sermon. We all learn, when we are kids about Jonah spending time in the belly of the whale, but if we stop there, we are robbed of the story of running away from God and God bringing us back. If we leave it at a cute story of a man in a whale, we miss the chance to see God's wonderful grace at work.

Our faith must continue to mature. And for that to happen, our understanding must continue to grow. That growth comes from spending time reading our Bibles, studying with others, and prayer. It means we must make time for God and God's Word in our lives.

6:35 – Called to order.

Opening Prayer – Joyce shared a devotional from the book "Devotions for Church Leaders and Small Groups", by Lynne Modranski, and led us in prayer. Rachel will share a devotional in October.

MOTION – by Ryan, second by Rachel, to approve the minutes from the August 10, 2023 meeting. – **Approved**

Building & Grounds Report –

John Oldenburg gave a report on the current Building & Grounds projects.

- Electronic sign The B&G committee, along with member Marie Way, was given the task of purchasing a double-sided electronic sign to be placed in the front of the church near the current signage. The committee physically evaluated the placement of a sign and concluded that for ideal visibility, it is best to have two separate single-sided signs. This would allow for the usage of the existing stone wall. John presented a drawing of the recommendation. Council unanimously liked the idea and look of the two signs. The committee will now get bids for the project. There is currently \$17,000 in the electronic sign fund.
- **Snow Removal** The committee has received two quotes from Reesman and Wanasek companies for parking lot, driveway, and sidewalk snow removal for the 2023/2024 season. They are waiting for a bid from Augies. A decision will be made at their September meeting.
- **Damaged Light** The damaged light in the parking area in front of the church has been repaired. John will make sure to check that it is working correctly.
- Stained Glass Windows Brian & Terry Erb have volunteered to chair this project. There are currently six stained glass windows displayed in the Narthex. Each window has a separate bidding sheet. The minimum bid for the large windows is \$70.00. The minimum bid for the smaller windows is \$40.00. The bidding will end on Sunday, September 24th. A decision will be made at that time on how to proceed with the sale of the other six windows. There are twelve windows in total.
- **Painting** John reported that member Ken Krause has finished his volunteer painting of the outside window frames, the outside of the storage room door and the air conditioning unit by the playground. Ken's generosity has much improved the appearance of the building. Council will send a thank you to Ken.
- Sanctuary A.C. Units John reported that there were two A.C. units in the sanctuary that were not working. Jim Mucci volunteered his expertise to combine the working parts of the units to make one of those units functional. The second unit will be repaired by Faust in the Spring. Thank you to Jim!
- **Roof Inspection** Bobbi informed the B&G committee that our insurance underwriter has taken drone pictures of the roof and are questioning its condition. The committee will conduct a formal inspection and get back to the insurance company. John is completing the requested questionnaire.
- Nursing Room John & Patty Oldenburg will make improvements to the Sunday School classroom that has been chosen as a nursing room for mothers. A chair will be purchased or provided. The clear glass in the door will be frosted and a curtain for the large hallway window will be installed.

Pastors' Report;

Pastor John shared that he helped Bob install a camera near the parking lot door, and he installed internet in the choir room.

He is encouraged by the young families that have been visiting Cross and by upcoming scheduled baptisms.

Ginny Richards, our faithful long-term organist, is still recovering. She hopes to come back to share her gifts soon.

Pastor will be participating in the Southern WI Conference meeting. This is a time for churches to get together.

Confirmation update; There are six 9th graders that will be confirmed in October. There are currently three 8th graders and nine 7th graders enrolled in confirmation class.

After Pastor's appeal for additional funds for the Discretionary Fund on Sunday September 10th, he received \$600.00 from the congregation.

The RIC annual meeting will be held on November 11. The theme is "We Love All." It will be held at Christ the Servant Church in Waukesha.

On a recent trip to Iowa, Pastor John visited Camp Courageous. This is a camp for people of all ages with varying disabilities. He is considering this camp for a 2024 confirmation mission trip.

Major Ministries

- **RIC Discussion** As our Council liaison, Joyce had some questions about involvement, decision making, confidentiality, training, and funding. Andy stated that we will be following the synod guidelines. The council will be engaged but not micro-managing. Joyce shared a pamphlet about 'New Beginnings', a women's shelter in Elkhorn. It is also a safe space for LGBTQIA youth to go.
- **RIC Partner Update** Andy stated he is getting encouraging feedback from Cross members. He has received many positive comments from his article in the newsletter. It was suggested that he send a letter in the mail to all Cross members regarding the core team for RIC. There has already been some interest in core team participation. He is also scheduling two mission moments in the upcoming weeks.
- Seminary Scholarship Fund Pastor John provided us with a brief profile of his son Joe. Joe has been a member at Cross for over a year. He received a psychology degree in Italy in just three years. He has been called to the seminary. In late August Pastor John dropped Joe off at Wartburg Seminary in Iowa. Joe has made a request for seminary assistance funding. Pastor John recused himself from council discussion. After discussion a motion was made.
- **MOTION** by Ryan, second by Rachel to approve seminary assistance funding to Joseph Brink. **Approved.**

Pastor John will contact the seminary for the needed paperwork.

Soup Suppers – Tabled until October.


Thank You Notes – Andy & Patty Pastor John closed with a prayer.


